Webinar: The Pandemic After the Pandemic – The Future of Mental Health

The British Columbia Chapter of the International Society of Certified Employee Benefit Specialists presents our final education session for 2021. The session will be preceded by a short chapter meeting, all are invited to attend.

The pandemic has exposed gaps in our health care system – we hadn't collectively taken mental health seriously, and although we are now on the brink of a mental health crisis employers can leverage technology to strengthen or launch a mental health strategy. Virtual therapy and digital mental health platforms are an effective alternative to traditional EAPs and “bricks and mortar” counselling solutions. Interventions like virtual therapy (i.e. synchronistic video counselling) have the potential to dramatically lower disability costs, improve access to mental health services and improve ROI-related data sets available to employers, while potentially reducing reliance on prescription drugs. So why aren't these technologies more widespread—especially when they're clinically validated? How can employers adopt and scale these services? In this presentation, Green Shield Canada will share their experiences with digital EAP, virtual therapy, their move into digital health, and their thoughts on where the Canadian mental health system needs to go next.
